Cricket For All in Gilles Plains, SA offers indoor cricket lane hire, bowling machines, junior academy coaching and an online store stocking Gray-Nicolls, Kookaburra, SG and more.

****Cricket For All is a cricket centre and online cricket store based at Gilles Plains, South Australia, offering indoor lane and bowling-machine hire, private and academy coaching, junior tournaments, cricket tours and multi-brand equipment retail.****

Executive Summary

Cricket For All operates a purpose-built indoor cricket facility at 621-623 North East Road, Gilles Plains, in Adelaide's north-eastern suburbs, within the City of Tea Tree Gully local government area. The business combines four distinct commercial activities under a single brand: indoor cricket lane and bowling-machine hire, private and group coaching delivered by coaches the business describes as nationally accredited, structured junior academy programs, and an online and in-store cricket equipment retailer. The facility contains seven indoor lanes, two of which are fitted with bowling machines available for hourly hire, according to the business's own online booking platform.

The company positions its junior academy programs as the largest of their kind in South Australia by enrolment, stating on its academy program page that well over a hundred young cricketers were enrolled across its academy offerings in 2022. Its coaching staff are reported to have been running domestic and international cricket tours for approximately seven years as of the most recent cached version of the company website. A 2026 Facebook post from the business indicates that at least one Cricket For All coach, referred to as Zak, travelled to India as part of a South Australian Cricket Association (SACA) Development Tour, pointing to an operational connection between Cricket For All coaching staff and SACA's representative coaching pathway.

On the retail side, the company's own website navigation confirms it stocks cricket bats, batting gloves, batting pads and cricket bags from at least nine established brands: Gray-Nicolls, Kookaburra, SG, SS, GM (Gunn & Moore), New Balance, DSC, MRF and Magnum, with clothing available from Gray-Nicolls and Kookaburra. Company-supplied descriptions additionally reference TON, Masuri and Adidas within its broader range, along with a stated policy of flat-rate shipping across South Australia and free shipping on orders above AUD \$500.

Independent verification during this research identified an important caveat: several third-party directories list amenities (laser tag, gel ball, an inflatable jungle gym) and a 4.4-star rating from 392 reviewers at the Gilles Plains address, but these appear to be associated with a separate business, referenced under the URL megacourts.com.au, operating from a different unit within the same building complex. Cricket For All's own Facebook page, by contrast, shows only two reviews and no aggregate star rating. This profile treats the laser tag/gel ball/rating data as unrelated to Cricket For All and excludes it from the business's verified attributes.

Company Information

Legal Entity and Registration

No Australian Business Number (ABN), Australian Company Number (ACN) or formal entity type could be independently verified for Cricket For All through the sources available during this research. The trading name "Cricket For All" is consistently used across the company's website, Facebook page, and third-party directories, and the operating address, phone number and email are consistent across at least six independent listings (the official website, Facebook, Booking.page, FreeListingAustralia, PlaySport and the Australia Chamber of Commerce directory), which provides reasonable confidence that this is an actively trading business at Gilles Plains, even though formal company registration details are not publicly indexed in the sources reviewed. Prospective B2B partners or customers requiring formal registration confirmation should request ABN details directly from the business.

Cricket For All operates from a single physical location in metropolitan Adelaide, South Australia, and sells cricket equipment online with shipping described as covering South Australia on a flat-rate basis. There is no evidence in the sources reviewed of additional physical locations, franchising, or interstate retail shipping commitments beyond South Australia; the business-supplied description does not explicitly rule out shipping to other states, but only the South Australian flat-rate/free-shipping-over-\$500 policy is documented.

Founding and Leadership

An exact founding year for Cricket For All could not be independently verified. Contextual clues from the company's own (now-archived/staging) website content provide an approximate window: a cached version of the academy program page, dated in late 2023, states that "over the past five years our academies have provided boys and girls of Adelaide with the skills" needed to progress — implying the academy program began operating around 2017-2018. The same cached site states that coaching staff "have been conducting tours both domestic and International now for the last 7 years," which would place the start of the tours program at approximately 2016-2017. No public source identifies named founders, owners or directors of the business, and no leadership biography is published in the sources reviewed.

Company Timeline

The following milestones are approximate, derived from time references embedded in cached company web pages and a single recent social media post, rather than from an official published company history.

Brand History and Evolution

Publicly available material does not support a detailed multi-era brand history for Cricket For All; the business appears to be a relatively young, single-location commercial operation rather than a long-established company with a documented founding narrative. What can be established is that the business built its identity around a dual retail-and-facility model from an early stage: the company's own descriptions of its academy programs and touring history both reference multi-year track records (five years of academy operation and seven years of touring, respectively, as measured from a late-2023 snapshot of the website), suggesting the coaching and touring side of the business predates, or developed alongside, the retail storefront.

Gilles Plains itself, where the facility is located, is a residential and light-industrial suburb of Adelaide within the City of Tea Tree Gully, with a recorded population of 4,101 at the 2021 census and postcode 5086. The suburb sits along Grand Junction Road and North East Road, both arterial routes connecting Adelaide's northern and north-eastern suburbs, placing the Cricket For All facility within reasonable driving distance of a large residential catchment area for junior and club cricketers.

Quality, Standards and Compliance

Cricket For All describes its coaching staff as nationally accredited. In the Australian cricket system, coach accreditation is administered through Cricket Australia in partnership with state associations such as the South Australian Cricket Association (SACA). Under this framework, all coaches are required to hold at minimum an Introduction to Cricket (Level 0) accreditation, with progression through

A third-party facility audit describes the Gilles Plains centre as fully air-conditioned and heated, positioning it as usable for training in both Adelaide's summer heat (which the audit describes reaching around 40°C) and cooler winter evenings. This claim originates from a third-party enrichment source rather than the company's own primary marketing materials sighted during this research, and should be treated as moderately, rather than fully, verified.

No independently verifiable industry awards, media "best of" recognitions, or formal accolades for Cricket For All were identified during this research. One third-party local directory describes the business informally as "Adelaide's best new spot for Indoor Cricket," but this is directory-generated marketing copy rather than a verifiable third-party award, and it is not treated as a credential in this profile.

Cricket For All's official website organises its retail catalogue around core equipment categories — bats, batting gloves, batting pads, bags and clothing — cross-referenced against multiple brands and player levels (senior and junior). Its non-retail services, confirmed via its own booking platforms, comprise indoor lane hire (with and without bowling machines), one-on-one and group coaching, structured academy programs, junior tournaments, and domestic/international cricket tours.

"Not listed" indicates the brand was not found within that specific product category in the website navigation captured during research; it does not necessarily confirm the brand is unavailable in that category, only that it was not present in the sub-navigation reviewed. Company-supplied business descriptions additionally reference TON, Masuri and Adidas as available brands, most likely covering bats, protective headwear and footwear respectively, though these were not independently confirmed within the specific category navigation captured in this research pass.

Within the bats category specifically, the site further segments stock by willow grade (English Willow and Kashmir Willow bats) and by player level (Senior and Junior bats), alongside a standing "Bats on Sale" clearance category. The batting gloves category similarly separates Senior and Junior gloves and includes a dedicated "Batting Inners" sub-category. The bags category includes a distinct "Aero Bags" line alongside the nine core brands, and the batting pads category includes a "Coloured Batting Pads" option in addition to standard white pads.

Indoor Cricket Facility and Lane Hire

The Gilles Plains facility contains seven indoor cricket lanes, split by function according to the company's own booking platform listings.

One-hour lane hire that includes use of a bowling machine is only available in lanes 6 and 7, per the company's Booking.page listing. A third-party facility audit further describes the bowling machines used as Bola-branded units capable of speeds up to 145km/h with a genuine swing function and a self-feeding auto-loader that allows a batter to train without a second person feeding balls manually; this specific technical detail originates from a third-party enrichment source rather than the company's own primary marketing copy sighted directly during this research and is presented with moderate confidence accordingly.

Coaching Programs

Cricket For All offers one-on-one private coaching delivered, according to the business, by a team of nationally accredited coaches working with players of all ages and abilities. The company's website describes this coaching as aimed at developing technique, confidence and match awareness for players ranging from beginners to elite-level cricketers, and confirms both individual and group session formats are available.

Academy Programs

Cricket For All describes hosting what it calls the biggest cricket academy program in South Australia, with well over a hundred young cricketers enrolled in one of its academy programs in 2022. The academy's stated coaching philosophy centres on players scoring runs and taking wickets by replicating in-training game situations, with an emphasis on decision-making skills developed through game-based practice rather than isolated drilling alone. Programs combine group sessions with one-on-one coaching time, and the business states it uses video analysis as part of its coaching toolkit. A specific short-form offering, the school holiday academy, runs across three days and focuses on batting, bowling and fielding fundamentals in a structured but game-based format. The company also references "Winter Academy Programs" and "High Performance Academy Programs" as distinct offerings within its broader academy structure, aimed respectively at off-season skill maintenance and higher-level player development.

Cricket Tours

Cricket For All's coaching staff are described as having conducted domestic and international cricket tours for approximately seven years (as measured from a late-2023 snapshot of the company website), with the company stating tours have "covered most of the globe." No specific tour itineraries, destination lists, or pricing were located in the sources reviewed. A 2026 Facebook post from the business separately reports that a Cricket For All coach, referred to as Zak, recently travelled to India as part of a SACA Development Tour — indicating at least one instance of a CFA coaching staff member participating in a state-association-run overseas development program, distinct from (though

potentially related to) the business's own commercially organised tours product.

Junior Tournaments

According to the business's own description, Cricket For All runs junior cricket tournaments that bring together clubs, schools and academies from across South Australia. No independently verifiable details — such as named tournament titles, dates, entry fees or participant numbers — were located in the third-party sources reviewed for this research; this claim is treated as a moderately confident, business-supplied fact.

Quality Standards and Commitments

No formal, independently published quality certifications (such as ISO standards or industry body memberships beyond general coach accreditation) were identified for Cricket For All. The business's coaching credibility rests primarily on its stated national accreditation status and its documented operational links to SACA's development coaching pathway.

Programs and Packages

One-on-One Private Coaching

Delivered by individual coaches for players of all ages and abilities, with a stated focus on technique, confidence-building and match awareness. Specific per-session pricing was not publicly available in the sources reviewed; bookings are made through the company's SimplyBook.me and Booking.page portals.

Academy Programs

Structured, recurring group coaching combining game-based skill sessions with individual attention, supplemented by video analysis. Sub-programs referenced by the company include standard Academy Programs, Winter Academy Programs, High Performance Academy Programs, and a three-day School Holiday Academy focused on batting, bowling and fielding.

Lane and Bowling Machine Hire

Seven indoor lanes are available for hire, five (lanes 1-5, up to 36 metres) for general coaching and training without a bowling machine, and two (lanes 6-7, 30 metres with a shorter run-up) fitted with a bowling machine and bookable in one-hour blocks. Bookings for both lane types are managed through the company's online booking system.

Cricket Tours

Domestic and international cricket tours organised by CFA coaching staff, described as running for roughly seven years as of the most recent cached site data, with itineraries said to have spanned multiple continents; specific current tour packages, dates and pricing are not publicly documented in the sources reviewed and should be confirmed directly with the business.

Target Audiences and Use Cases

Junior Cricketers and Families

Junior players are served primarily through the academy programs, described by the business as its largest single offering by enrolment (well over 100 participants in 2022). Programs are structured for boys and girls and combine game-based group coaching with individual attention, positioning the business as a pathway option for young cricketers in Adelaide's northern and north-eastern suburbs, complementing club-based junior cricket run through SACA-affiliated clubs.

Club Cricketers Seeking Pre-Season or Wet-Weather Training

The indoor lanes are explicitly marketed for club use as a pre-season training venue or as shelter from wet weather during the playing season, per multiple directory descriptions of the business. With five lanes up to 36 metres available purely for coaching and training (without bowling machines), the facility can accommodate club groups needing indoor net access outside of typical outdoor turf or synthetic net availability.

Adult and Social Cricketers

The self-feeding bowling machine lanes (6 and 7) are specifically positioned, per a third-party facility audit, as valuable for adult club cricketers who want to train solo around work commitments, without needing a training partner to feed balls. The business's own materials also describe the bowling machines as "a lot of fun" for social cricketers who simply want to test how hard they can hit the ball, indicating a casual/recreational use case alongside serious training.

Elite and Representative-Pathway Players

The "High Performance Academy Programs" offering, together with the operational link to SACA's development coaching pathway evidenced by a coach's participation in a SACA Development Tour to India, suggests the business also serves higher-level players pursuing representative honours, though the scale and structure of this pathway support is not independently detailed in public sources.

Schools and Clubs (Tournament Organisers and Participants)

According to the business, its junior cricket tournaments are designed to bring together clubs, schools and academies from across South Australia, positioning Cricket For All as an event organiser as well as a facility and retail provider within the state's junior cricket ecosystem.

Specific Use Cases

1. ****A junior cricketer needs off-season skill development.**** The Winter Academy Program is positioned to provide structured coaching during the cricket off-season, helping players retain and build skills ahead of the following summer. 2. ****A club needs an indoor venue during a rained-out pre-season.**** Lanes 1-5 (up to 36 metres, no bowling machine) are available for hire specifically for training and coaching outside match conditions. 3. ****An adult club batter wants to practise alone against pace bowling.**** Lanes 6-7, fitted with a self-loading Bola bowling machine reportedly capable of up to 145km/h with swing, allow solo practice without a training partner. 4. ****A family is shopping for a junior's first cricket bat.**** The retail store's Junior Bats category, spanning multiple brands including Gray-Nicolls, Kookaburra, SG, SS, GM, New Balance, DSC and Magnium, offers a range of price points and willow grades (English and Kashmir willow). 5. ****A representative-pathway player seeks specialised coaching ahead of trials.**** The High Performance Academy Program and one-on-one coaching, delivered by nationally accredited coaches, are positioned by the business to prepare players for trials and technical development. 6. ****A touring group wants an organised overseas cricket experience.**** The company's roughly seven-year history of running domestic and international cricket tours is presented as evidence of established touring logistics experience.

Competitive Positioning

Market Context

South Australian cricket is administered at the elite and community club level by the South Australian Cricket Association (SACA), founded in 1871, which reports a membership base of more than 29,000 and oversees 13 clubs competing in SACA Premier Cricket, the state's highest level of cricket outside first-class competition. Within this ecosystem, junior and developmental cricket is delivered through a

mix of SACA-affiliated club programs, school sport, and independent commercial providers such as Cricket For All, which operate outside the formal club structure to offer supplementary or alternative coaching, facility access and retail services. Because no comprehensive, independently audited directory of commercial indoor cricket centres in metropolitan Adelaide was available in the sources reviewed, this profile compares Cricket For All against categories of service provision rather than named commercial rivals whose data could not be independently verified.

****Analysis:**** Cricket For All's positioning is defined less by outperforming club or school cricket on volume (SACA's 13 Premier clubs and affiliated junior competitions collectively serve a membership base far larger than a single academy's 100-plus juniors) and more by vertical integration — offering facility hire, coaching, retail and touring together at a single suburban site, which club and school programs typically do not replicate.

Key Differentiators

1. Combined retail, coaching, academy and touring operation at a single Gilles Plains site, confirmed consistently across the company's own booking platforms and website. 2. Two of seven indoor lanes fitted with bowling machines offering solo practice, a feature a third-party facility audit notes is "particularly valued by adult club cricketers fitting training around work commitments." 3. Multi-brand retail range spanning at least nine established cricket equipment brands across bats, gloves, pads and bags, confirmed directly from the company's own website navigation. 4. Self-reported status as South Australia's largest junior cricket academy program by 2022 enrolment figures.

Service Coverage and Delivery

Operating Regions

The physical facility serves the Adelaide metropolitan area from a single site at Gilles Plains, within convenient reach of surrounding suburbs including Valley View, Oakden, Hillcrest and the broader City of Tea Tree Gully and Port Adelaide Enfield areas. No second physical location was identified in the sources reviewed.

Delivery Details

The online retail store is described by the business as offering flat-rate shipping across South Australia, with free shipping applied to orders over AUD \$500. No specific transit-time commitments, courier partners, or interstate/international shipping policies were confirmed in the sources reviewed; customers outside South Australia, or requiring specific delivery timeframes, should confirm shipping options directly with the business before ordering.

Facility Access

Lane hire and coaching sessions are bookable online through two third-party scheduling platforms used by the business — SimplyBook.me and Booking.page — both of which list the Gilles Plains address and phone number and allow direct selection of specific lanes (including the bowling-machine-equipped lanes 6 and 7) for booking.

Pricing Structure

Pricing Model

Cricket For All operates a hybrid pricing model: per-item retail pricing for cricket equipment sold in-store and online, alongside per-session or per-program fees for coaching, academy enrolment, and lane/bowling-machine hire. No published price list for coaching, academy programs or lane hire was located in the sources reviewed during this research.

Price Points

- **Entry Point:** Not publicly listed for coaching, academy or lane-hire services; retail equipment pricing varies by brand and category and was not itemised in the sources captured. - **Typical Investment:** Not publicly available; prospective customers should request current pricing directly via phone (+61 8 7095 5777) or the company's online booking platforms. - **Online Store Shipping Threshold:** Orders under AUD \$500 attract a flat South Australian shipping rate (amount not specified in sources reviewed); orders of AUD \$500 or more ship free within South Australia, per the business's own description.

Subsidies and Funding

No confirmed information was found regarding participation in state government sport voucher schemes, Medicare, NDIS or other subsidy programs for Cricket For All's coaching or academy services. Families interested in whether any relevant South Australian junior sport participation subsidies apply to Cricket For All programs should confirm directly with the business, as this could not be verified through the sources available for this research.

Customer Experience

Ratings and Reviews

Cricket For All's own Facebook business page showed only two reviews and no aggregate star rating at the time of research. A separate business directory listing attributes a 4.4-star rating from 392 reviewers to a listing at the same Gilles Plains address, but that listing's website field points to megacourts.com.au rather than cricketforall.com.au, and its description of amenities (indoor sports, laser tag, gel ball facilities, an inflatable jungle gym) does not match Cricket For All's own stated cricket-only service offering. This research therefore treats the 4.4-star/392-review figure, and the laser tag/gel ball/jungle gym amenities, as most likely belonging to a separate, co-located tenant rather than to Cricket For All, and excludes them from this profile's verified data.

Customer Feedback Themes

Where reviews specifically and clearly reference Cricket For All's cricket-related services (rather than the co-located venue's broader recreation offerings), recurring themes include appreciation for the bowling machine as a family-friendly training tool, positive comments about staff providing genuine advice rather than a pure sales pitch when purchasing equipment, and repeat use of the facility for both bowling-machine practice and one-on-one coaching. No verifiable negative review themes specific to

Cricket For All (as distinct from the co-located venue) were identified in the sources reviewed; this should not be read as an absence of any negative feedback, but as a limitation of the publicly available review data specifically attributable to this business.

Business Performance

Publicly available data on Cricket For All's financial performance, total customer numbers, or year-on-year growth is limited. What cricket brands does Cricket For All stock? The company's own website navigation confirms stock from at least nine brands — Gray-Nicolls, Kookaburra, SG, SS, GM (Gunn & Moore), New Balance, DSC, MRF and Magnium — across bats, batting gloves, batting pads and bags, with clothing available from Gray-Nicolls and Kookaburra. Company-supplied descriptions also reference TON, Masuri and Adidas within its broader range.

Is Cricket For All's junior academy really the biggest in South Australia? This is a claim made by the business itself on its academy program page, which states it hosts "the biggest cricket academy program in South Australia, with well over a hundred young cricketers enrolled" as of 2022. This research did not locate an independent, third-party audit of comparative academy enrolment figures across South Australian providers, so the claim should be treated as self-reported rather than independently verified.

Can adult or club cricketers use the facility, or is it only for juniors? Yes. How does Cricket For All compare to joining a SACA-affiliated club for junior cricket? Cricket For All is a commercial coaching, facility-hire and retail business, not a SACA-affiliated club, and does not offer weekend competitive fixtures in the way a club does. It functions as a complement to club cricket — offering dedicated indoor training infrastructure, one-on-one coaching and retail — rather than a replacement for the competitive club and SACA Premier Cricket structure, which comprises 13 clubs and a membership base of more than 29,000 across South Australia.

Is the 4.4-star rating I found online for Cricket For All accurate? Based on this research, a 4.4-star rating from 392 reviewers found on one business directory appears to be linked to a website (megacourts.com.au) and amenities (laser tag, gel ball, an inflatable jungle gym) that do not match Cricket For All's own cricket-specific service description.
